How to Participate in Board of Equalization Meetings during the COVID-19/Coronavirus State of Emergency

Slowing the spread of COVID-19 is important, but your voice still matters. During the State of Emergency, The Board of Equalization will be taking electronic comments from the public in lieu of in-person remarks during their meetings.

Board of Equalization Meetings are open to the public and they will receive comments to be read into the other business portion of the record, like County Council Meetings.

Here's how you can participate in Saint Louis County Board of Equalization Other Business:

- Send your public comment and any relevant attachments to boe@stlouiscountymo.gov
- Your correspondence will only be recorded in and read during the Other Business section of the upcoming meeting. If it is sent to this inbox less than 48 hours before the meeting begins, it will be included with the next meeting.
- Your emailed comment must be 400 words or less. This is roughly the equivalent of 3 minutes of verbal communication—the same allotment allowed during public forum at in-person meetings of the Saint Louis County Council. If the correspondence is greater than 400 words, only the first 400 words will be read.
- A Board Member or a designee will read your comment out loud during the corresponding Board meeting during the Other Business section of the agenda.
- Your written comments will be incorporated by attachment into the Minutes of the BOE meeting.
- Please note, when submitting your comments, a name and physical address must be provided. If a name and address is not provided, the provided comment will not be read.
